



Southeastern Iowa Synod Hunger Grants

The Southeastern Iowa Synod is pleased to announce that applications for hunger grants are currently being accepted.

Eligibility

Congregations, organizations, and ecumenical groups on the territory of the synod are encouraged to apply for a grant. These will be entities that are engaged in or seek to be engaged in efforts to feed hungry people and/or to increase the nutritional value of existing feeding programs. Emphasis will be placed on increasing the on-going capacity for hunger ministry on the territory of this synod.

Grants

Grants ranging from \$100 to \$1000 will be awarded to those demonstrating on the application that the grant will be used to increase the capacity to serve hungry people through the local effort. Specific details regarding hoped for goals and outcomes will be a significant factor in awarding the grant. All projects must be directed toward anti-hunger efforts on the territory of the Southeastern Iowa Synod.

Timeline

Grant applications will be received in the Office of the Bishop of the Southeastern Iowa Synod through *November 1, 2017*, or until all available funds have been distributed. Checks will be mailed immediately upon approval of the grant application.

Reporting

Grant recipients will be expected to share stories regarding the use of the funds with this synod so that they may be included in various publications and media. Photographs and videos as well as personal interest stories are encouraged.
